



Max Diem received his Vordiplom in Chemistry at the Universität Karlsruhe, Germany in 1970, and his PhD in Physical Chemistry in 1976 at the University of Toledo, OH, USA. He worked in the laboratory of Prof. Laurence Nafie at Syracuse University (Syracuse, NU, USA) as a postdoc between 1976 and 1978. He then joined the faculty of the Chemistry Department of the City University of New York, Hunter College, where he was promoted to Professor of Chemistry in 1987. In 2005, he moved his research group to the Department of Chemistry and Chemical Biology at Northeastern University in Boston. Prof. Diem's research interests during the first two decades of his academic career dealt mostly with the emerging field of vibrational optical activity (infrared circular dichroism and Raman optical activity). During a sabbatical leave of absence in 1996, he started to focus his attention on the application of vibrational spectroscopy for medical diagnosis. He is the author or co-author of about two books, ten book chapters, and 150 papers.
